Pianist Wu Han and cellist David Finckel are co-artistic directors of the Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center. Violinist Philip Setzer, formerly of the Emerson Quartet, is artistic director of the Cleveland Institute of Music's String Chamber Music Program. <p>Balourdet String Quartet with Adam W. Sadberry, flute Sunday, Nov. 3, 2024 3:00 p.m.</p>	<p>The Balourdet are graduate quartet artists in residence at Indiana University's Jacobs School of Music and winners of the Chamber Music America (CMA) 2024 Cleveland Quartet Award, among numerous awards. As a musician and educator, Sadberry is known for his citizenry, creativity, and vibrancy both on and off stage. Members of the Balourdet participate in our Partnerships in Education program in local high schools.</p>
<p>Benett Tsai, cello Sunday, March 16, 2025 3:00 p.m.</p>	<p>Tsai appears as the recipient of the Friends of Music Concerts Performance Award, and in 2023 won the Susan Wadsworth International Auditions in New York. Born in Australia, Tsai made his debut at the age of 13 and has performed as a soloist with orchestras in Germany and Australia. His playing is described as "charismatic, heartfelt ... full of fluid intensity." <i>Sydney Arts Guide</i></p>
<p>Megan Moore, mezzo- soprano, and Francesco Barfoed, piano Sunday, March 30, 2025 3:00 p.m.</p>	<p>Moore has appeared at the Metropolitan Opera, Seattle Opera and San Diego Opera, among prominent companies. Her roles include Rosina in Rossini's "Barber of Seville" and the title roles in Rossini's "La Cenerentola" and Massenet's "Cendrillon." A young artist on the rise, Danish-Italian pianist Barfoed often collaborates with singers. Barfoed and Moore won first prize in the Copenhagen Lied-Duo Competition. Both are previous winners of our Performance Award.</p>
<p>Jerusalem String Quartet Sunday, May 4, 2025 8:00 p.m.</p>	<p>The Jerusalem quartet possesses a distinguished 30-year history and is a regular and beloved guest on the world's great concert stages. Their experience has resulted in a wide repertoire and stunning depth of expression, which carries on the string quartet tradition in a unique manner. The ensemble has found its core in a warm, full, human sound and an egalitarian balance between high and low voices. "An absolute triumph.
